# THE CONSTITUTION OF THE UNITED STATES

insure domestic Tranquillity, and establish this Constitution  
and our Power.

Section 1. All legislative Powers herein granted shall be vested in a Congress of the United States, which shall consist of a Senate and House of Representatives.

Section 2. The House of Representatives shall be composed of Members chosen every second Year by the People of the several States, and in each State shall have the Qualifications requisite for Electors of the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.  
No Person shall be a Representative who shall not have attained to the Age of twenty five Years, and been seven Years a Citizen of the United States, and who shall not, when elected, be an Inhabitant of that State in which he shall be chosen.  
Representatives and direct Taxes shall be apportioned among the several States which may be included within this Union, according to their respective Numbers, which shall be determined by adding to the whole Number of free Persons, including those bound to Service for a Term of Years, and excluding all Indians not taxed, three fifths of all other Persons. The actual Enumeration shall be made within three Years after the first Meeting of the Congress, and within each Enumeration shall be made, the State of New Hampshire shall be reckoned as they shall by Law direct. The Number of Representatives shall not exceed one for every thirty thousand, but each State shall have at least one Representative, and the Electors in each State shall have the Qualification requisite for Electors in the most numerous Branch of the State Legislature.

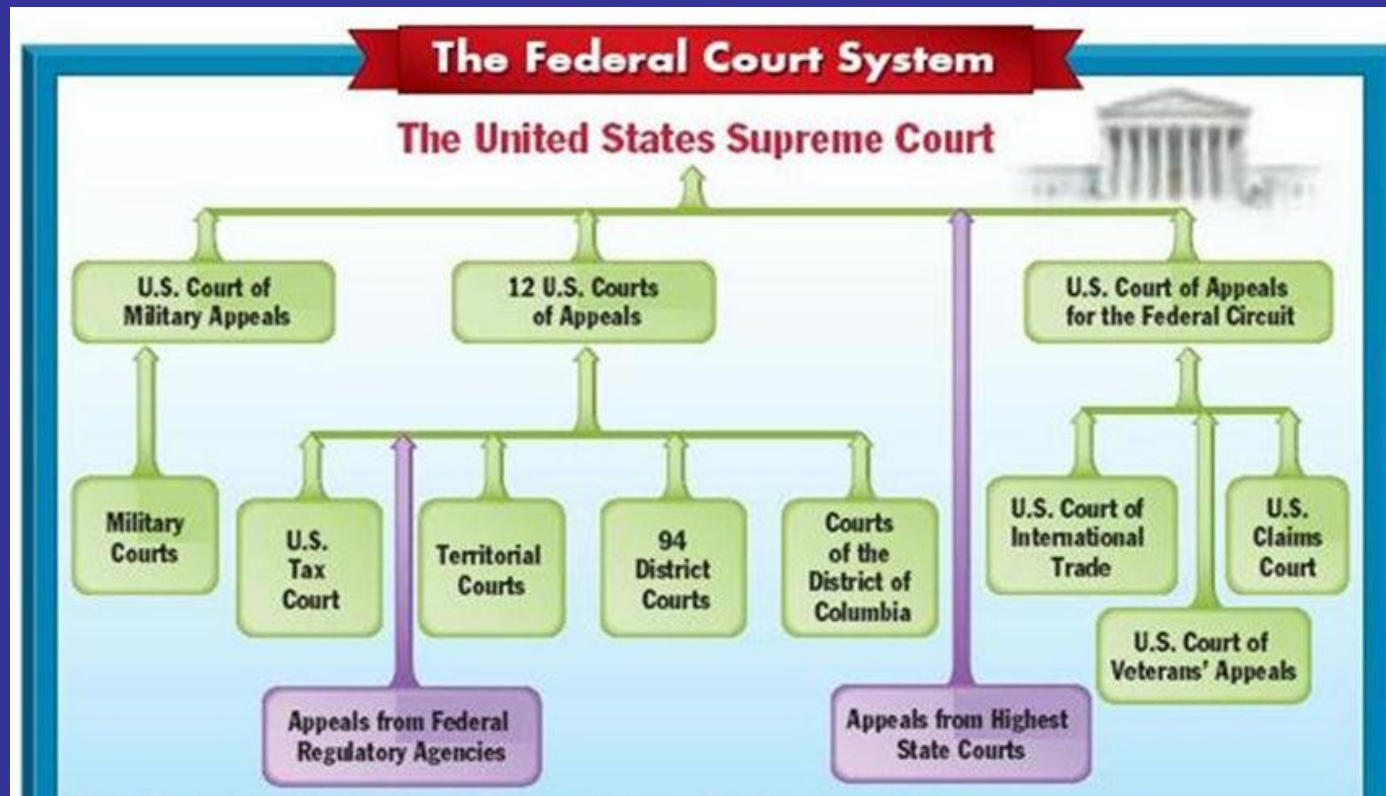

## ROSENBERGS DIE

### Pair Executed for Atom Spying



**Supreme Court and Eisenhower Reject Couple's Last Pleas**

OSSENING, N.Y., June 19 — Atom Spies Julius and Ethel Rosenberg died in Sing Sing Prison's electric chair shortly before sundown today. The executions followed quickly after the Supreme Court set aside a stay of execution granted Wednesday by Justice William O. Douglas and President Eisenhower's refusal to grant them clemency.

**SING SING PRISON, N.Y., June 19 (AP)** Atom Spies Julius and Ethel Rosenberg were ordered electrocuted late today for betraying their country's secrets to Russia and threatening the lives of millions by bringing the world closer to an atomic war.

The Justice Department set the time for the doomed couple's death in Sing Sing Prison's electric chair after a day of suspense in which the U.S. Supreme Court denied their final appeals and President Eisenhower again refused executive clemency.

Warren Wilentz Dorn announced that the husband and wife espionage team would be put to death in the unprecedented prison's death chamber "before sundown," which comes at 8:50 p.m. (5:30 P.M.T.) today at Sing Sing.

Later he said the first gasolines would come at 8 p.m. EST, with the second a few minutes later.

**Special Time Together**

The Jewish Sabbath starts at sundown, and the plea to commute the couple before that time, instead of at the traditional 11 p.m., were announced after the prison warden said he would ask the Rosenbergs if they wanted to request a delay until tomorrow night.

The Rosenbergs spent their last afternoon together and then ate a dinner of regular prison fare—hand-cut
